Edited volume on political ethnography has become widely recognized as foundational text for studying the political realm using ethnographic methods within the fields of sociology and political science. Citation count refers only to book and co-authored introduction, excluding references to individual chapters by prominent scholars. Cited widely in academic publications and listed as required reading in several graduate course syllabi. Citation count is not declining over time but rather remains steady as book retains its place as an early and fundamental source for studying politics through ethnographic methods.

"Sexy Ladies Sexing Ladies: Women as Consumers in Strip Clubs," 17 citations. Wosick-Correa & Joseph, 2008. (May 15, 2015)

This equally co-authored article has gained heavy traction as a staple citation in several sub-fields of sexualities research, including research on women as consumers of sex work in general and women as both customers and workers within strip clubs. Citation venues include a wide variety of articles and books on sexualities by reputable researchers and publishers; article was also cited in at least two recently-released textbooks on human sexuality.

This article, published online in late 2012, is now routinely cited in the emerging body of research on male clients of (female and male) sex workers.
